Appleshaw Visit

School who have commented about our recent visit: "We had a great visit from the Recycling Stars Team in July. We played a game where we had to sort rubbish, we learnt about how materials can be reused and turned into useful items or even art! We also learnt about plastic in the ocean and how some sea creatures confused plastic for food get caught up in plastic packaging. Because we learnt so much, we presented what we had found out to the whole school. We talked to the classes about how to recycle properly and what things you can do to reduce waste".

World Wildlife Week

During the summer term, we attended Knightwood Primary School in Valley Park to help with their themed week. David Bassett (teacher) said "We arranged for Test Valley to come in and



teach our children about litter and recycling. The team were fantastic! Not only did they cater for all classes and year groups, but they went above and beyond to make sure that each year group's tasks were differentiated for their age and ability, whilst also relating to the National Curriculum. brought a range of materials with them, which kept the children engaged at all times, and the children thoroughly enjoyed themselves. On top of this, children of all ages came away with a secure understanding of how and what to recycle, whilst showing enthusiasm to go home and educate their parents on what they had learnt as well. Environmental Action at The Romsey School

We have recently been working with The Romsey School's Eco-Group to explore how we might be able to provide support. Under the guidance of teacher Steve Stannard and his colleagues, the Eco Group has been very active over the last year helping the school's students explore the problems that plastic waste poses to ecosystems and human health. This awareness has led to a number of practical changes at the school from setting up recycling bins through to helping to reduce or eliminate single use plastic across the school. The Eco-Group are also developing an action plan to consolidate some of the practical actions they have already carried out. The picture is a customised recycling bin designed by the Eco-Group.
