
Cllr Dowden is pleased to inform Valley Park residents and visitors that all pathways have been refurbished at Knightwood Leisure Centre.



Knightwood BMX is a thriving BMX club based at the BMX track at Knightwood Leisure Centre and is completely run by volunteers. It is thanks to these volunteers that over 100 junior and some 12 adult members are able to enjoy weekly lessons throughout the year. The club welcomes riders of any age or ability, with the youngest member being only 5 years old. The weekly lessons see riders learning life skills not only on a bike, but also about camaraderie and sportsmanship. The club maintains a fleet of bikes, with the associated safety equipment, which riders can borrow as part of their lessons. These loaned bikes enable families to participate in the sport by removing any financial barriers that might otherwise prevent them from joining.

Riders from within the club participate in regional competitions across the country with recent success at the British BMX Championships where one club rider became the British Champion of his age bracket.

Valley Park Parish Council was pleased to help with much needed funds to enable new equipment to be purchased and other necessary maintenance of the track and equipment.

## **News in Brief**

- Valley Park has maintained the lowest Council Tax in Test Valley Borough by far. The Parish has reduced its element of the Council Tax by 40% from 13 years ago.
- Our hanging baskets were back this summer and next year we are looking forward to a fantastic floral display.
- Welcome to Andrew Beesley who was recently appointed as a Parish Councillor.
- The Parish Council submitted a CIL bid for funding to the Test Valley Borough Council to create six new community orchards, by planting local historic fruit trees across Valley Park. Some traditional larger trees will be planted to help screen the industrial buildings in School Lane. A signposted nature trail will provide a walking route linking the orchards. Volunteers will help with the planting and the "Friends of the Park" volunteers will help with the long term maintenance.
- As part of the annual programme of works being undertaken by Operation Resilience, surface treatment works will be undertaken on the footways in various locations. The purpose of the treatment, which consists of a Footway Micro Asphalt, is to preserve the footway in good condition for the longest possible time. It seals the structure from water ingress, arresting the formation of defects. The works are now in a programme and are due to start in November.
